

<p style="text-align: center;">English</p> <p>Writing instructions: remember to use imperative verbs (bossy words) e.g. cut, take, put, chop, stir, draw, tie, roll, drag, etc. When setting out your instructions use numbers to order your instructions.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cook/ bake something (with adult help) then write instructions so somebody else would know what to do. • Write instructions for planting your seeds (Science) and then for looking after them. <p>Practice your common exception words: write sentences using them. Go onto ictgames .com and play: Look, Cover Check, The Dinosaur's Eggs, and Phonics Finder</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Maths</p> <p>Capacity: Find different containers from around your home, order them from which you think holds the most to the least. Then check by measuring. Record the containers and how much they hold in ml's. Length: Measure different objects around your house using cm's (measuring tape) . Draw different lines, can you estimate how long they will be and then measure using a ruler. Record your estimates and then measurements. Fractions; Find different fractions of different numbers. E.g. $\frac{3}{4}$ of 24 = Remember to draw your workings out. Keep counting forwards and backwards in steps of 1,2,5,10's from different starting numbers.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Science</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Plants some seeds. Put them in different places around the home to see how this affects their growth. E.g. fridge, windowsill, dark cupboard, and in a sealed plastic bag. Make a diary of how they grow and any observations of changes from week to week. • Choose an animal . Create a home for it that would provide for all it's needs to stay alive and healthy. You can make this using construction materials, playdough, junk modelling, outdoor resources, or draw using pencils/pens or on a computer paint programme or app. Label each part with details. • Ictgames.com: Nocturnal Animals, has N.F about different animals.
