- Continues to build relationships with peers and adult.
- Ask for help from an adult if they need it
- Talks to others about their own interests
- Talk about their feelings using our weekly Jigsaw PSHE sessions.
- Recognises when they feel blue, green, red and what they can
 do to get back to green (zones of regulation)
- Develop independence skills

Maths

- Estimates quantities of objects
- Investigates turning and flipping objects in order to make shapes fit and create models
- Uses formal and informal language to describe shapes
- Creates and recreates repeating pattern using a range of everyday objects.
- Count objects, actions and sounds
- Recite numbers 0-10, forwards and backwards. Key vocabulary that your child will be learning:

Shape, pattern, flat, curved, straight, round, solid, corner, face, side, edge, , cube, pyramid, sphere, cone, circle, triangle, square, rectangle, star, pattern, repeating pattern, match

Communication and language

- Follow a story without pictures or prompts
- Listen and respond to others during conversations and group discussions
- Retell familiar stories using repetition as well as in their own words.

Physical development

- Make sure they are safe when trying new challenges and manage risk by taking action or warning others, such as not running in front of scooters.
- Moving confidently in lots of different ways such running, walking, shuffling and hopping.
- Can explain the importance of brushing our teeth.
- Can carry out and describe some movements for others to copy such as jumping and skipping.
- Weekly PE lessons using the Get Set 4 PE scheme.
- Develop tripod pencil grip. Form lower case letters correctly.

Literacy

- Begins to recognise some written names of those who are familiar to them such as Mummy, Daddy or sibling names.
- Hears and says sounds in words.
- Uses phonic knowledge when creating texts such as lists, cards and invitations.
- Weekly drawing club; children will have the opportunity to invent stories and create drawings and their own written work linked to this.

Understanding the World

- Explore the local area
- Look at patterns and changes in nature and the seasons as well as animals and plants.
- Know similarities and differences between themselves and others, including families, communities, cultures and traditions.
- Talk about images from the past.
- Talk about members of their family and their community.
- Recognise different celebrations that take place amongst different cultures.
- Use different tools in an app/program.

Expressive art and Design

- Build a collection of songs matching pitch and melody
